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PARTS OF SPEECH REVIEW: COMMON AND PROPER NOUNS



A **noun** is a word that names a person, place, thing, or idea.

A **common noun** names a *general* type of person, place, thing, or idea. It doesn't start with a capital letter unless it's the first word of a sentence.

Examples: teacher, city, landmark

A **proper noun** is the *specific* name of a person, place, thing, or idea. It always starts with a capital letter.

Examples: Mrs. Smith, Chicago, Taj Mahal
