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## What you need:

$\bigcirc$ Tools: scissors or utility/craft knife; all-purpose glue or school glue; and perforation cutter (optional).
$\bigcirc$ Print in Letter-size paper. Ideal paper weight: 150 to 200 GSM.

## Assembling tips:

$\bigcirc$ Mark the dotted lines with the backside of a cutter's cutting edge or a ballpoint pen without ink if you don't have a perforation knife. It is recomended that you mark the lines before cutting the outlines.

- Cut the pieces as you need them, so you don't lose the references.
- Stick one flap at a time using small amounts of glue. Press for a few seconds to make sure each one is well glued.

## BIRD A.



STEP 1: Body. Paste together pieces A1, A2, and $A 3$ as shown in this graphic.


STEP 2: Beak. First paste the flap of piece A4 indicated in the graphic. Then paste the rest, closing the piece.


STEP 3: Wings. Join pieces A5 and A6 to the body.


Close the piece, pasting these two caps at the end.


Join the beak to the reference point on the bird's face.


STEP 4: Crest. Paste piece A7 on top of the head.


STEP 5: Tail. Glue the white side of piece A8 and close it.

## BIRD B.



STEP 1: Body. Paste together pieces B1 and B2 as shown in this graphic.


STEP 2: Beak. First paste the flap of piece B3 indicated in the graphic. Then paste the rest, closing the piece.


Then, paste the tab of the tail below the body.
The first bird is ready!


Close the piece, pasting these two caps at the end.


Join the beak to the point of reference on the bird's face.


STEP 3: Wings. Join pieces B4 and B5 to the body.


STEP 5: Tail. Glue the white side of piece B7 and close it.


STEP 4: Crest. Paste piece B6 on top of the head.


Then, paste the tab of the tail below the body.
The second bird is ready!
